Philippians 4:6-7 - "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

That passage was easier to adhere to just a few days ago! It's amazing how quickly life can change; in this case it's on a world-wide basis. However, as we navigate through this surprising season together, let me begin with some things I am thankful for.

#1 God's proven faithfulness. He is never anxious. He is never caught off guard. Over the years I have stood in constant amazement of his ability to take those things that are evil, wrong, or, in this case, the reminders that we live in a sin infected world, and he somehow brings good out of them for His glory. As I have had the privilege of talking with numerous spiritual leaders over the last few days, it is evident that God is doing that even now.

#2 I am convinced that this recent Sunday (March 22) more Americans heard at least a portion of the Word of God than possibly any other Sunday in our nation's great history. I have yet to come across a pastor who was not surprised and encouraged by the amount of people who logged into their online service, in whatever capacity it was delivered. This has been the most encouraging impact of what we are going through I have heard thus far. All of us know from experience that once the Word of God goes out and it gets into someone's heart it has an amazing power to transform. Numerous Americans who found themselves at home Sunday morning, isolated, stressed out, and in need of hope logged in and listened to a church service!

#3 For our pastors and churches who have embraced this time and, through the Holy Spirit's leadership, are finding new and, in some cases, very inventive means to minister to both those who know and those who, as of yet, do not know Christ.


It is important for you to know that as a church you are part of a larger family here in the Inland Empire. We have churches who have offered to help if you need to record your online service earlier in the week and don't have the proper equipment to do that well. We have also found a number of online giving approaches that are easy to set up and use. Every pastor I have chatted with has asked that we give them a call if they can help others. Please contact us and we will do what we can to help you overcome the barrier you are facing or find someone to provide the needed expertise. You will also find in the Clarion a number of Zoom meetings. We have 5 pastor breakfast and lunch gatherings each month, and for at least the next month they will be Zoom meetings. We will also be setting up some weekly online meetings for our spiritual leaders to become tighter, to share ideas, and most important to hear and pray for one another.

Here are some of the common prayer requests I have heard:

- 1. That our spiritual leaders would stay emotionally and physically healthy as they minister to others.
- 2. Finances are a big concern. It is too early to tell, but some churches I have spoken to have already seen somewhat of a drop. Pray that God, through his people and in whatever means he chooses, will sustain our churches financially through this time and that the leaders of each church would have great wisdom when it comes to financial stewardship during this very uncertain season.
- 3. That those who are "checking out" church online will indeed come when we can gather together again and experience the needed refreshment, excitement and acceptance that we all need when we meet together as church families.
- 4. Many of our churches meet in schools and of course are unable to meet there now. Yet there is also great uncertainly that when life get back to a normal flow, when and if those schools are going to allow them back to use the facilities. This is a very hard time for new church plants and many of our language churches who most always feel the financial hit the hardest.

Please pray for us as well, that we would be wise in our words, wise in the Association's resources, and that we would be a meaningful resource for our pastors and churches as we go through this unique time as the Family of God.

God's Goodness: His Unexplainable Benevolence

Bible Verse: Read Corinthians 2:9, NLT

That is what the Scriptures mean when they say, "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared for those who love him (1 Corinthians 2:9, NLT)."

Benevolence is an action. Even though it is a noun, it is still a verb. Benevolence is the action of doing good to another person or object. We can show goodness to another person by providing comfort or support in the time of need. However, we also perform an act of goodness when we pick up a piece of trash that destroys the beauty of creation or could possibly be harmful to an animal.

God is good, all the time. His actions are always a result of goodness because He is Good. In being goodness itself, He is always good to us.

God is Benevolent

- 1. God's Goodness is Revealed in God's Limitless Provision: 1 Corinthians 2:9 tells us that our human eyes cannot see, our human ears cannot hear, and our minds cannot fathom in any way the good things that God has prepared for those who love Him. In our wildest dreams we cannot conceive, in our finite minds we cannot perceive, all that God has planned for us.
 - Love is and always has been connected to faithfulness and obedience. If I say I love someone and continually disobey them, my love is all words and no action. That great theologian Clint Black sings, "Love isn't something that we're in, it's something that we do." Jesus says, "If you love Me, obey (keep, NKJV) My commandments (John 14:15, NLT)."
- 2. Benevolence is tied to holiness: "Is there any god who is as great as our God," asks the Psalmist in Psalm 77:13-15? The answer to this rhetorical question is "no." Verse13 says, "Your ways, O God, are holy". Our God has worked wonders and miracles on this earth with mankind watching. He continues to work these miracles every day. God has not only saved us, but in His goodness, He will raise us from the dead according to 1 Corinthians 6:14.
- 3. Benevolence is expressed in His mercy: His love for us and goodness to us knows no boundaries. God's mercy is included in this everlasting love. In God's mercy, we see His deep and abiding compassion for us, His kindness towards us, and His unending forgiveness (<u>Titus 3:4-5</u>)

WHAT IS A WORKSHOP ON **BIBLICAL EXPOSITION?**

The Workshops on Biblical Exposition aim to recover the centrality of God's Word, preached expositionally, to the benefit of the life and health of the church in our generation. In order for this kind of preaching to take place, the Bible must be properly understood and rightly handled. To that end, each Workshop consists of two and a half days covering Principles of Exposition (instructional talks on how to better handle biblical texts), Small **Group Practice** (when you will share and receive feedback on two passages you prepare in advance), and **Preaching** (encouraging exposition). Each of these sessions is carefully designed to be interrelated for the greatest value in improving your work.
